



ABOUT CENTER FOR THE ARTS EVERGREEN AND THE EVERGREEN SCULPTURE SHOWCASE

After 28 years as an independent all-volunteer non-profit organization, Sculpture Showcase (SE) merged with Center for the Arts Evergreen (CAE) in Evergreen, Colorado, in 2023. CAE has been proud to continue Sculpture Showcase's mission to collect, display, and maintain sculptural art in predominantly outdoor locations that are freely accessible to the public every day of the week. The sculptures can be viewed and experienced by walking or driving through the Evergreen area.

Sculpture Showcase. This yearly competition brings a lively diversity of high-quality sculpture to the mountain area. Artwork is selected from many submissions and then loaned to CAE for a year. Each of the artists whose work is selected is paid an honorarium, and an annual award is given to one selected by a juror. CAE is thrilled to have taken on the legacy and responsibility of SE and the Sculpture Showcase in our mountain town.

Sculpture Evergreen was originally incorporated in November 1994 as art for the Mountain Community, with the purpose of placing high-quality enduring sculpture in public places in the mountain area of Jefferson County. SE's first project was to commission a large, original piece of sculpture to be placed outside the Evergreen Lake House. *Spirits of the Land* by Madeline Wiener was selected and installed in 1996. In 1997, two limestone benches with bronze plaques acknowledging major donors, including the Scientific and Cultural Facilities District (SCFD), were installed. In subsequent years, SE added more than 40 sculptures to the permanent collection. In 1999 SE began a new venture, the annual Sculpture Walk, now known as the

This map showing the locations of the permanent sculptures and Sculpture Showcase art is produced each year and widely distributed. A map of the sculptures is also available on the CAE website. All of the Showcase sculptures are for sale, and many have become part of the permanent collection thanks to donations from individuals and others. To maintain this and all of its programs, CAE receives valuable grant support from the SCFD and Colorado Creative Industries (CCI). CAE is also indebted to the generous property owners who allow sculptures to be placed in accessible and scenic locations throughout the community.

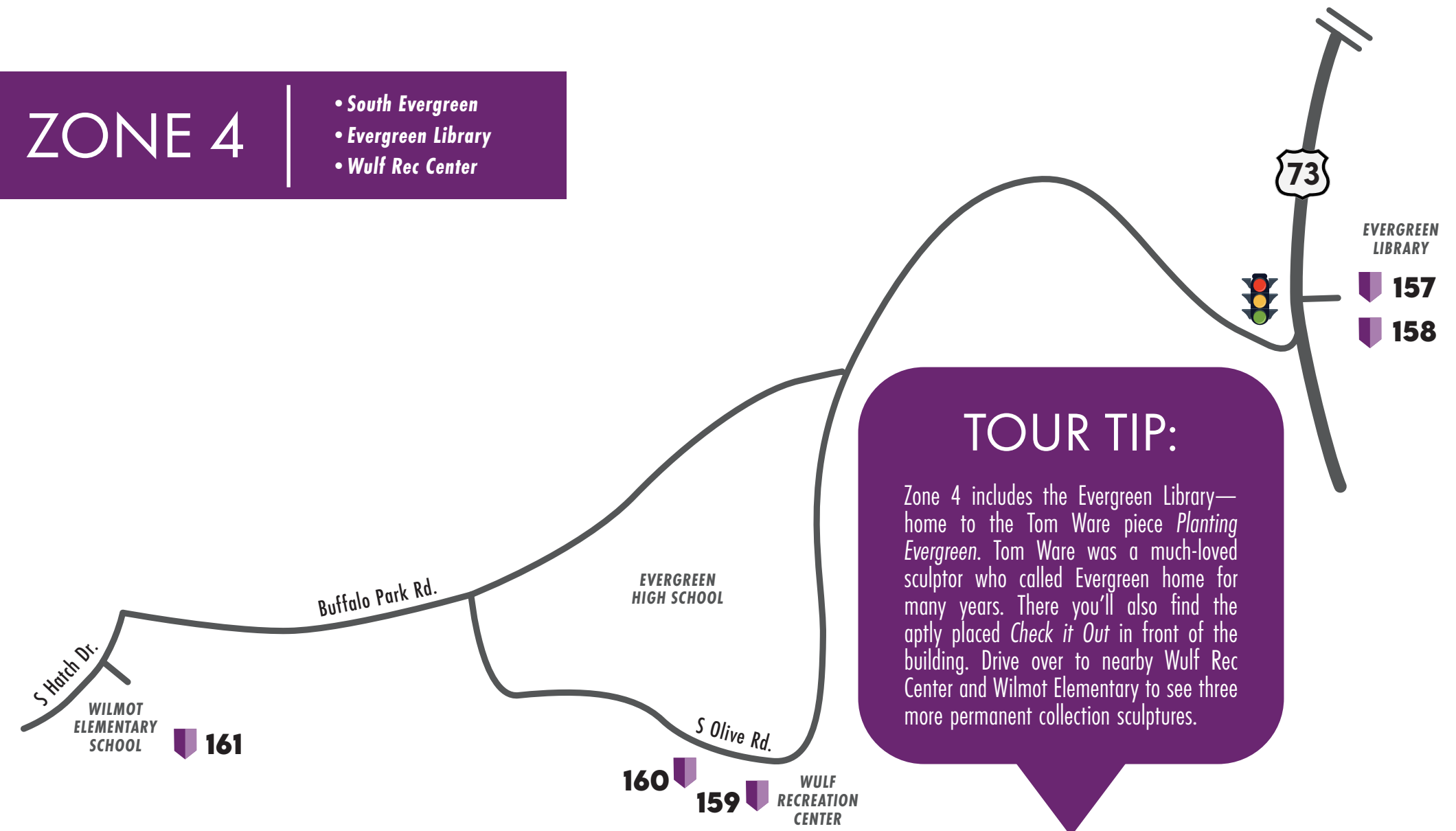

2026-27 ANNUAL SCULPTURE SHOWCASE ARTIST STATEMENTS

- DESCENDING**
RENO CAROLLO | AURORA, CO
Descending, which represents a figure descending steps, is produced in a cubistic style. This abstract figurative style of work is similar to *Intimacy*, another piece in CAE's collection.
- AS ONE**
JERRY SEVERNS | DENVER, CO
Many elements in my sculptures can be imagined as beings or paths. Some are coming together; some may be pulling apart. The sculpture is a segment in time. Those experiencing the sculpture may consider what has come before and what is to follow, as well as the possibilities and value of the unknown.
- STALWART**
PAUL REIMER | CRANBROOK, BRITISH COLUMBIA
This impressionist-style sculpture of a lone ponderosa pine shaped by the elements represents the rugged beauty of Colorado's world-renowned natural landscape. In form and materials, it speaks to the resiliency of nature.
- TRIANGULATION**
PATI STAJCAR | GOLDEN, CO
The elusive cougar is a true beauty to behold in its natural form. This study in triangles takes that beauty to the next step in the progression from realism to stylization.
- PHOENIX RISING**
ADAM SCHULTZ | LOVELAND, CO
Created from the fires of molten metal, this cast-bronze sculpture represents literally, symbolically, and throughout history, ideas about transformation, cycles of life, and spiritual renewal. Looking at this sculpture helps to remind me that sometimes beautiful things can emerge from a seemingly devastating situation.
- TAKE THE FIELD + NATURAL GRACE**
MICHAEL BARLOW | BILLINGS, MT
Take the Field is a depiction of a powerful springing whitetail buck, and *Natural Grace* an agile bounding whitetail doe. I focused on capturing their anatomy and surface details with careful precision, aiming for a realistic and dynamic representation.
- MAGPIE**
FRED LUNGER | PARKER, CO
As with many of my sculptures, the design starts with the base. In this case I found an old water pump at an antique store. The age and wear of this pump led me to imagine sitting out back of an old farmhouse watching the birds play in the field and then seeing a Black-Billed Magpie taking a break from the fun and resting on the handle of the pump.
- SELF REFLECTION - DEPTHS**
GARRETT LOVELESS | DRAPER, UT
Self Reflection - Depths examines the holes we have in our perceptions of ourselves while simultaneously exploring how others may have a clearer view of parts of us that we do not fully understand. The outsider is missing context and history; the individual is missing a detached perspective.
- ICHTHYOLOGY**
CHARLOTTE & BEN ZINK | BERTHOUD, CO
Mermaids, water lovers, and poets are welcome to take a pause here, take a picture here, and maybe daydream for a while with these fanciful fishes. An unexpected splash of color on your walk about town, this fun steel trio brings a little whimsy and maybe a call to get down to the river and cast a line.
- THIS MOMENT**
FRANK HIFFERNAN | EARLING, IA
Falling in love, a child's first birthday, celebrating a special occasion. These experiences breathe life into our hearts and are captured in our memories forever. For me, this sculpture is a gesture toward the joy that I feel when I experience something new, magical, and unexpected. Sometimes it feels like *This Moment* is all we need.
